SUBJECT: Pocono Raceway NASCAR Events

House Resolution 237 of 2005 called on the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to assess the economic impact of the two NASCAR races held at the Pocono Raceway, the Pocono 500 and the Pennsylvania 500. As we do not have the inhouse expertise to conduct such a study, we solicited proposals for a contractor to do the study for us. We received several proposals, but all were substantially more costly than the LB&FC officers were willing to consider. Instead, the Officers authorized us to work with the resolution's sponsor to craft a more limited approach that would still provide useful information.

The result of this effort is attached in the form of a letter, plus attachments, from Mr. Bruce Yerger, Vice President of Operations at Buchart Horn, Inc./Basco Associates, with whom we contracted to provide certain focused information. Specifically, the letter and attachments provide information on in-state and out-of-state attendance at the two races; an estimate of the direct, indirect, and induced economic impact of the two races; and information on the economic impact of the approximately 57 other motor racetracks across the Commonwealth.

We are also providing a copy of this memorandum report to the sponsors of HR 237 and will make it available to others upon request. Please contact me if you have any questions about this matter.

Dear Mr. Durgin:

As per our proposal dated October 7, 2005, Buchart Horn, Inc./BASCO Associates (BH/BA) performed the outlined Scope of Work and provide the following confidential draft report.

- ➢ BH/BA conducted a survey, by telephone and/or email, of the 61 racetracks in Pennsylvania as identified by the ARCA Publication. Four (4) of the 61 tracks were closed by the end of 2005. Of the remaining 57 tracks, (Pocono 500 results to be addressed separately below) after repeated attempts, responses were received from 21 tracks. Those track results (details attached¹) were as follows:
 - Number of race events per year: 535
 - 2. Average ticket price: \$10.60
 - 3. Average event attendance: 885

Given the results of the survey from the 21 tracks, it could be concluded that 1,450-1,500 race events are held in Pennsylvania in a given year with total attendance of 1,300,000-1,350,000 spectators.

The result of 36% response is direct expenditures for tickets only of \$5,009,375. The estimated multiplier to determine total (direct, indirect and induced economic impact) for the statewide track revenue is 1.99 (from Pennsylvania Tourism Office – D.K. Shifflet, Inc., 2003 data). Direct expenditures x 1.99 = \$5,009,375 x 1.99. The estimated direct, indirect and induced impact of these 21 tracks is \$9,968,656 in 2005. Given the representative sample of 21 tracks, this would indicate a potential impact of \$25-30 million for the tracks in Pennsylvania (exclusive of the Pocono 500 and Pennsylvania 500).

> The two events, the Pocono 500, held June 12, 2005 and the Pennsylvania 500 each generate attendance of 150,000 spectators.

The direct, indirect and induced impact of the Pocono 500 and Pennsylvania 500 is determined to be \$363,055,475 (details attached²).

Department of Revenue sales tax figures (details attached³) from Carbon, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike and Wayne Counties for food services and drinking places, gasoline stations, hotels and motels combined are as follows:

April 2005	\$3,057,000
May 2005	\$2,878,000
June 2005	\$3,077,000
July 2005	\$3,820,000
August 2005	\$3,418,000
September 2005	\$3,106,000

While some of the July sales tax revenue can be attributed to remittances from quarterly, semi-annual and annual filers, it can be concluded that the impact of the June 12th and July 24th events provided significant contribution to the increases.

In summary, auto racing is extremely important to Pennsylvania. It generates over 1,450 events per year, with attendance at these events approaching 1,600,000 spectators along with a direct, indirect and induced impact of over \$390,000,000.
